Horse/rider combinations that are jumping over 3'6" are not eligible for children's amateur adult classes. Class may be divided if entries warrant.

(Any child entered in these classes will be eligible to enter the Beginner's Pleasure Division.) Shall show at a walk and trot or jog only both ways of the ring.

To be judged on manners, suitability of horse to rider and performance.

Same horse/pony rider combination cannot show in any other rated division except Equitation. Horses may be shown by another rider in any other division or section at the same show except Jr. Hunter. Ponies may not cross enter into the regular pony hunter division. Children's Hunter riders may not show in any class where the fence heights exceed 3'6" at the same show. Jogging for soundness at the discretion of the judge. All classes will be judged on performance and soundness unless otherwise noted.

In classes over fences ponies not exceeding 12.2 hands to jump 2'3", ponies over 12.2 but exceeding 13.2 hands to jump 2'6", ponies over 13.2 to jump 3'. All classes to be judged on performance and soundness unless otherwise noted. Manners and suitability of the pony to the rider shall be emphasized and extreme speed penalized. Division will be divided if entries warrant.

May be run as separate divisions if entries warrant.

To be judged on performance, soundness, manners, way of going, size of rider to mount and suitability as an Adult Amateur Hunter. Horses and ponies may be jogged for soundness at Judge’s discretion. Height of fences 3’, spreads not to exceed height of fence. Ponies may be ridden by adults, suitability to count.

Open to adult amateur members of the New England Horseman’s council. All contestants are required to perform over at least eight fences not to exceed 3’. One or more individual tests of the top four contestants may be requested at the judge’s discretion (USEF current tests 1-19). To fill a class, **at least 4 competitors must complete the course.**

MHC Junior Medal Class

Non-Rated NEHC or USEF

Open to junior members of MHC who have not reached their 18th birthday. All contestants are required to perform over at least 8 fences not to exceed 3’. Ten points are required to qualify for the finals. After qualifying, contestant is no longer eligible to enter this class. One or more tests of the top four contestants may be requested at the judge’s discretion. To fill a class **at least 4 competitors must complete the course.**

MHC Adult Medal Class

Non-Rated NEHC/USEF

Open to adult members of MHC. All contestants are required to perform over at least 8 fences of 2’6” to 2’9” with at least one change of direction. One or more individual test of the top 4 contestants maybe requested at the judges discretion (USAE tests 1-19). To fill a class, **at least 4 competitors must complete to course.** After qualifying a contestant may continue to enter this class.

MHC MINI MEDAL CLASS

Non-Rated NEHC/USEF

Open to members of MHC who have not reached their 15th birthday and have not competed in a class that requires them to jump higher than 3’. All contestants are required to perform over a course of 6-8 fences set at a height that does not exceed 2’6”. One or more individual tests may be requested at judge’s discretion. To fill a class, **at least 4 contestants must complete the course.** After qualifying a contestant is no longer eligible to compete in this class.

Pessoa/USEF National Hunter Seat Medal presented by Becker College

USEF RATED - MHC/NEHC Non-Rated

Open to Junior Active Members of the Federation who have not reached their 18th birthday. To be shown over a course of not less than eight obstacles at 3’6” width must include one combination including an oxer and two changes of direction (change of lead) after the first obstacle. Two or more tests of the top four competitors are required. Test 1-19. **To fill a class six competitors must complete to course.**

ASPCA Horsemanship Class
USEF Rated - MHC & NEH Non-rated

All contestants are required to perform over at least 8 fences at 3'6" with or without wings. A minimum of 12 riders, if available, are required to show at a walk, trot and canter. To be judged on seat, hands, guidance and control of horse. Under saddle performance of those riders selected to show under saddle shall count 50%. USEF Test 1-19. To fill a class, six (6) competitors must complete the course. Any rider who will not be eligible to compete in the next year as a junior should not compete in qualify in classes after August 31st.

54) ASPCA MACLAY

Ariat National Adult Medal

Open to all Amateur members of the USEF and CEF who are eligible to compete in the Adult Amateur Hunter Section at this show. Effective December 1, 1997: a rider may not compete at the same horse show in any hunter or equitation class in which the jumps exceed three feet, three inches (3'3"). To be shown over a minimum of eight fences not to exceed 3' in height, spread not to exceed fence height. The course may be either a Jumper or Hunter type course and must include at least two changes of direction and a combination. Water obstacles (i.e.; water jump, Liverpool) are not permitted. The top four riders are required to perform at least two individual tests from USEF Tests 1-19. An Open Numerical Scoring System must be used in the first round, with each rider's score announced at the completion of their round. There is no minimum requirement to fill the class.

56) Ariat National Adult Medal

Show Circuit Magazine National Children's Medal

Open to all junior members of the USEF and CEF who have never competed in a National Equitation Final with fences at 3'6" (i.e.; Pessoa/USEF Medal; ASPCA Maclay; USET; CET or CEF Finals; WIHS Capital Cup). To be shown over a minimum of eight fences 2'9" to 3' in height, spread not to exceed fence height. The course may be either a Jumper or Hunter type course and must include at least two changes of direction and a combination. Water obstacles (i.e.; water jump, Liverpool) are not permitted. The top four riders are required to perform at least two individual tests from USEF Tests 1-19. An Open Numerical Scoring System must be used in the first round, with each rider's score announced at the completion of their round. There is no minimum requirement to fill the class.

USEF Show Jumping Talent Search

USEF RATED - MHC/NEHC Non-Rated

A test of the abilities of an individual as a show jumping rider, is open to Junior/Young Riders who are members of the Federations, who have not reached their 21st birthday under Federation rules. Competitors must use the same horse in both phases. Competitors may ride stallions. The jumping phase of the class shall be over a course of at least 10 fences from 3'6" to 3'9" in height with spreads to 5'. Each course must contain no fewer than 3 fences set at 3'9" in heights. The course must include a double and a triple combination or 3 Doubles. Additional spread fences are required elsewhere on the course and an obstacle with water is recommended. To be judged on style and execution. Time and jumping faults should be taken into consideration in the judge's evaluation of the rider. To fill a class, SIX (6) COMPETITORS MUST COMPLETE TO COURSE.

GRANITE STATE ADULT MEDAL

Fences not to exceed 2'9". Amateur riders 18 years of age and older must accumulate 12 points in order to qualify. Riders will be required to perform over a minimum of 8 fences with at least one change of direction. 25% of the riders must be called back for individual testing: USEF Test 1-8.

GRANITE STATE CHILDREN'S MEDAL

Fence heights not to exceed 2'3" Junior riders who haven't shown over 2'6" at a recognized show must accumulate 12 point to qualify May be referred to as Granite State 2'3" Mini Medal in rule book. Riders will be required to perform over a minimum of 6 fences with at least one change of direction. 25% of the riders must be called back for individual testing. USEF Test 1-18.

Rules & Regulations

- 1) Every class offered herein which is covered by the rules & specifications of the current USEF rulebook will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith.
- 2) Entry fees for classes are: Non-rated \$15, Rated \$25, Medal classes \$30, Warm-up classes \$20.
- 3) Trophy prize or cash award will be offered in each class, along with 6 ribbons (8 ribbons in all rated hunter & equitation classes). Championship and reserve will be awarded on points in all Jumper & Hunter Divisions.
- 4) Prize moneys will be deducted from entry fees with any remaining balance paid in cash the day of the horse show.
- 5) Post entries are welcome, and will be charged a one-time fee of \$25 per horse and rider combination
- 7) Stabling is limited. Stalls are permanent with doors and initial bedding. Fee is \$100 per night. Day stalls also available, fee \$50.00 per day. Please call the office at 978-692-7060 to inquire about stalls.
- 8) For jumper classes, jumping order will be assigned as per the USEF Rule book.
- 9) For Jumper classes, all ties for other than first place will remain tied.
- 10) For Jumper classes, prize money shall be split, 1st 40%, 2nd 25%, 3rd 15%, 4th 10%, 5th 5%, 6th 5%.
- 11) For Hunter classes: All classes will be judged on performance and soundness unless otherwise noted.
- 12) Food will be available on the grounds
- 13) Management reserves the right to cancel or combine classes as well as change officials.
- 14) No rider under 18 may compete on or handle a stallion while on the grounds.
- 15) Horse and Pony Measurement will be held at 10:30, please notify the office prior to the show date if you need a horse or pony measured.
- 16) Classes will be held in one or both of our 80'x100' indoors for in climate weather. Indoors have sand and clay footing. Shows may also be held in our outdoor 100' x 200' sand ring, weather permitting.
- 17) **Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Preliminary Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advance Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides provided the respective breed/discipline dues or breed/discipline category fee has been paid. A nonmember may participate as a handler, rider, divers, owner, lessee, agent, coach or trainer at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a \$20 nonmember fee and a \$5 breed/discipline category fee for each breed/discipline. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions; 8) Opportunity classes; 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.**
- 18) Protective Headgear. All exhibitors are required to wear properly fitted ASTM/SEI approved headgear while mounted. Harness must be secured and properly fitted while riding in designated schooling areas, exercise areas or in the show ring.
- 19) All dogs must be restrained at all times while on the show grounds. Dogs are not allowed in the barns or arenas.
- 20) Check returned by the bank for any reason will be assessed a \$50 fee.
- 21) Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allow them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles on the competition grounds of recognized competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above-described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s) and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the offense. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s) and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed against any of the above individuals in accordance with Rule 6. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.
